

## The Research Education and Training Program is now online!

The Research Education and Training Program (RETP) is an initiative of the WA Health Translation Network (WAHTN) funded by the Department of Health (WA).

Western Australia's Chief Medical Officer, Professor Gary Geelhoed launched the program on Tuesday 27 September 2016 announcing that five new 'Good Clinical Practice' training modules are now available online on the RETP website.

The RETP aims to provide busy health practitioners with open access to comprehensive research skills training across the entire research process. The benefits of a well-trained health research work force include a higher standard of meaningful research projects, a greater likelihood of successful completion and most importantly, better health outcomes for study participants and the broader WA community.

### The Program aims to provide:

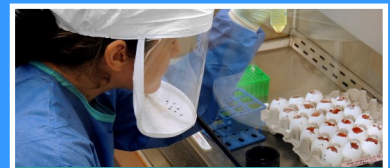
- A range of online training modules across the whole research process

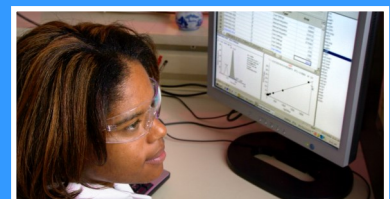

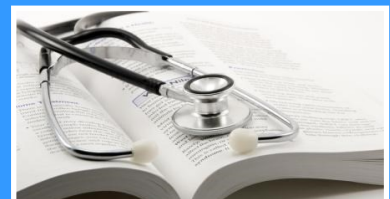
