Professor Richard Lindley MBBS, MD, FRCP (Edin), FRACP Australia

Richard Lindley is Professor of Geriatric Medicine at Sydney Medical School, University of Sydney. His career has focused on finding reliable new evidence to improve treatments for older people. He is a world-renowned geriatrician, stroke physician and researcher.

His current research includes a trial evaluating the effectiveness of adopting evidence-based best practice in hospitals to manage acute stroke patients. He continues to work in clinical practice at Blacktown Hospital, Sydney and runs a large portfolio of clinical trials at The George Institute and the Sydney Medical School's Lifespan Research group. He is an Associate Editor for the Australasian Journal on Ageing and is an Honorary Member of the British Association of Neurologists. He has published widely on clinical aspects of stroke, vascular disease, vaccination, infectious disease and geriatric medicine.

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
