



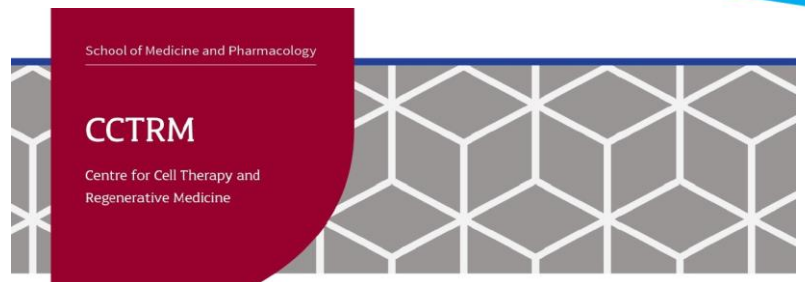

Professor Alaina Ammit  
Biomedical Scientist, University of Sydney

**"Targeting inflammatory mechanisms in chronic respiratory diseases"**

Professor Ammit is a biomedical scientist with an international reputation for her research elucidating the mechanistic basis of inflammation in respiratory diseases. Graduating with a PhD from University of Sydney in 1996, Alaina has received prestigious fellowships to support her postdoctoral career, including the Asthma Foundation Martin Hardie Research Fellowship and a NHMRC CJ Martin Fellowship (conducted at the University of Pennsylvania). Appointed to a Faculty position at the University of Sydney in 2002, she was promoted to Professor in 2014 and Head of the Respiratory Research Theme. In March 2016, she was recruited to the Woolcock Institute of Medical Research as the Director of the Woolcock Emphysema Centre, in collaboration with UTS where she has a continuing research-intensive role as Professor of Respiratory Pharmacology. Professor Ammit has received a career total of > \$3 million in grant and fellowship funding from the NHMRC and has attracted over \$1 million in project and equipment grant funding from local or NSW-based funders, approximately \$2 million in multicentre collaborative equipment grants from the NHMRC and the ARC, and ~ \$300,000 in philanthropic funding. She has published over 100 papers in high impact journals and demonstrated research leadership through international research contributions and high level engagement with the research community. Her current appointments include ARC College of Experts (2014-2017) and Editorial Board Member of the journals Allergy, Scientific Reports and Respiratory Research; and in the past she has served on NHMRC Grant Review Panels (including Chair of NHMRC ECF Training Fellowships 2012-2013), Associate Dean (Research) (2006-2010), and Executive Director and Honorary Secretary of the Australian Society for Medical Research (2005-2007).
