WAHTN and the other members of the **Australian Health Research Alliance** (AHRA) bring together universities. Medical

Research Institutes and clinical services to improve collaboration in medical research and its timely translation into practice.

After five years and under the direction of the Board and input from our twenty partners we have further refined our Vision, Mission and Purpose, and can clearly see how WAHTN can add value to the WA medical research environment. WAHTN has played a unique role in bringing WA researchers together in response to a disparate range of challenges such as COVID-19, biobanking, medical research imaging infrastructure and research-related legislation.

This experience has helped us formulate new Strategic Goals and Activities grouped under four pillars.

Our membership of AHRA continues to open up examples of national collaboration and opportunities otherwise denied WA researchers. COVID-19 has emphasised that medical research is an essential element of a modern health system and not an expendable add-on. Given this renewed interest in and resourcing of research and innovation in WA, WAHTN looks forward to the next five years.
